Now in its 61st edition, the Ceramics New Zealand National Exhibition stands as a landmark celebration of contemporary ceramic practice. From 279 submissions across the motu, judges Peata Larkin, Grace Lai, and Moyra Elliott have carefully selected 61 finalists, whose works represent the breadth and vitality of ceramics in Aotearoa today.

Their discerning eye recognises not only technical skill but also creativity, innovation, and the unique voices shaping the field.

The exhibition brings together an inspiring range of practice, from finely crafted functional wares to ambitious sculptural forms. Collectively, these works offer a vivid portrait of ceramic arts in New Zealand — a field that continues to honour tradition while evolving with boldness and imagination. Convened in Auckland by Siriporn Falcon–Grey, the exhibition celebrates the extraordinary commitment of artists who shape, fire, and transform clay into works of resonance and beauty.

Since the first exhibition of New Zealand Studio Potters at the Otago Museum in 1957, the National Exhibition has grown into a cornerstone of the country's creative life. Its legacy continues here, in the 61st exhibition — a moment to recognise excellence, celebrate achievement, and connect with the enduring power of clay.
